

Edible Austin held their sixth annual Chef Auction in October featuring some of Austin's best chefs. Proceeds are donated to two non-profits who greatly impact the local food community. This year's beneficiaries were the Sustainable Food Center and Urban Roots. Urban Roots uses food and forming to transform the lives of young people and inspire, engage, and nourish the community. They provide paid internships to Austin youth between the ages of 14 and 17 to work or their 3.5 acre urban sustainable form in East Austin. The program allows youth interns a stable, supportive work environment along with a variety of workshops on sustainable agriculture, healthy lifestyles, life and job skills and food justice issues. The Urban Roots farm donates 40% of their harvest to local soup kitchens and food pantries.
